STEP ONE

Look at what you are already doing.

Are you doing any of the following right now?

- Conducting a food drive with a local group such as 4-H, FFA, or Collegiate Farm Bureau?
- Collecting food during your county annual meeting or at your local county office?
- Donating an extra row in your home garden?
- Donating extra produce from a local farmers market?
- Collecting funds for a local food bank in your community?
- Hosting a service project at a local food bank?
- Hosting a district-wide activity like a trap shoot or golf outing where proceeds benefit a local hunger relief organization?

If you answer yes to any of the questions above, you are participating in the Harvest for All campaign. This initiative was not created to be a burden upon the Farm Bureau membership; the goal is to enhance what you are already doing and promote awareness of hunger in your community.
