2014 Vote Record - State Issues

Education

Michigan Merit Curriculum

HB 4465 and HB 4466 expanded flexibility in the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements to allow more students to participate in agriscience education and FFA programs.



Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Transportation

Commercial Motor Vehicle Marking

SB 277 amended the state's vehicle code to remove the requirement for commercial vehicles weighing more than 5,000 pounds to display the owner's information.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

House vote: 101 yes 7 no 2 not voting

Senate vote: 38 yes 0 no

Transportation Funding Package

The transportation funding legislation approved by the legislature was comprised of eleven bills, however four primary bills included the most significant changes to rejuvenate the state's failing road and bridge network by generating an estimated \$1.3 billion annually in transportation funds.



Farm Bureau supported a yes vote on all four bills.

HJR UU places a measure before Michigan voters to increase the sales tax by 1 percent on the May 2015 ballot.

House vote: 94 yes 16 no

Senate vote: 23 yes 12 no

HB 4539 and HB 5477 eliminated the per-gallon flat excise tax—and the sales tax collected on gasoline and diesel—to replace it with a wholesale tax that would raise approximately the same amount the state currently collects on motor fuel taxes, but be dedicated solely to roads.

House vote: 82 yes 22 no

Senate vote: 23 yes 15 no

HB 5477

House vote: 93 yes 17 no

Senate vote: 23 yes 15 no

HB 4630 modified vehicle registration fees. Currently, after a vehicle is purchased the registration fee decreases slightly over a three-year period. Instead, the fee would remain the same as the day of purchase. A surcharge would also be placed on electric and hybrid vehicles.

House vote: 67 yes 43 no

Senate vote: 23 yes 15 no

Truck Weight Changes (Senate-only vote)

If passed, SB 1150 would have removed Michigan's longstanding axle weight limits and replaced it with a maximum gross vehicle weight of 80,000 pounds. Farm Bureau policy supports the state's current axle weight limits.



Farm Bureau supported a no vote.

Senate vote: 15 yes 22 no 1 not voting

Natural Resources

Bear Crop Damage Permits



HB 5226 allows bears to be taken outside of open season if the Department of Natural Resources determines bears have been causing damage to crops or feed in accordance with normal agricultural practices.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

House vote: 105 yes 4 no 1 not voting

Senate vote: 37 yes 1 no

Wildlife Initiative

IL 2 was a citizen-led initiative that established the Scientific Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act to keep authority for game designation with the Natural Resources Commission.



Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

House vote: 65 yes 43 no 2 not voting

Senate vote: 23 yes 10 no 5 not voting

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Agriculture

Industrial Hemp

HB 5439 and HB 5440 created the Industrial Hemp Research Act and allows the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development or a Michigan college or university to grow and cultivate industrial hemp for agricultural or academic research purposes.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

HB 5439

House vote: 109 yes 0 no 1 not voting

Senate vote: 27 yes 10 no 1 not voting

HB 5440

House vote: 108 yes 1 no 1 not voting

Senate vote: 25 yes 12 no 1 not voting

Beneficial Reuse of Byproducts

HB 5401 created new standards for the reuse of approved beneficial byproducts to allow for land application. Byproducts for use in agriculture may provide benefits such as soil water retention and aeration, or plant nutrient value.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

House vote: 105 yes 4 no 1 not voting

Senate vote: 37 yes 1 no

Environment

Wood Heater Regulations

SB 910 prohibits the Department of Environmental Quality from issuing rules limiting emissions from wood heaters or enforcing any federal regulations doing the same.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

House vote: 68 yes 41 no 1 not voting

Senate vote: 25 yes 12 no 1 not voting

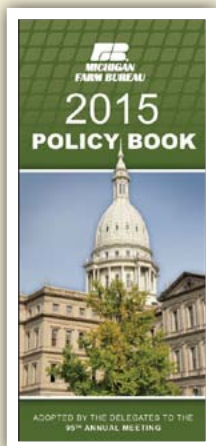

2014 Vote Record - Federal Issues

Farm Bill

H.R. 2642, the final version of the 2014 Farm Bill, provided for the continuation of, and several reforms to, programs managed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture through fiscal year 2018.



Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Water Resources Reform and Development



H.R. 3080, the Water Resources Reform and Development Act of 2014, plays an important role in ensuring the U.S. has an efficient and reliable inland waterway system

linked to ports for the agriculture industry to provide affordable farm products domestically and to compete internationally.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Small Business Expensing (House-only vote)

H.R. 4457 would have allowed for permanent small business expensing. Expensing allows a taxpayer to



deduct all or part of the cost of new or used business property rather than depreciating the cost over a longer period of time. Immediate expensing allows farmers to cash flow purchases that otherwise would be impossible or that would require them to incur debt expense when purchases cannot be delayed.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Bonus Depreciation (House-only vote)



H.R. 4718 would have created permanent bonus depreciation and expanded it to include the planting of fruit or nut bearing trees and vines.

Depreciation allows farmers to better manage cash flow, minimize tax liabilities and reduce borrowing. Bonus depreciation gives those who exceed expensing limits a way to upgrade and modernize their businesses.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Highway Program Funding

H.R. 5021, the Highway and Transportation Funding Act of 2014 continued funding of federal highway programs including reimbursements to states for road and bridge construction, transit infrastructure and operations, and safety programs.



Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Reducing Regulatory Burdens (House-only vote)

H.R. 935 would have prohibited the the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or a state agency, from requiring a permit for a discharge from a point source into navigable waters, of a pesticide authorized under the the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Waters of the U.S. (House-only vote)



If passed, H.R. 5078 would have prevented the EPA and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers from implementing it's proposed waters of the U.S. rule.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Commodity Futures Trading Commission (House-only vote)

If passed, H.R. 4413 would have reauthorized the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, a government agency that regulates futures and options markets.

Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.

Tax Extenders

H.R. 5771, retroactively reinstated—for 2014 only— more than 50 tax provisions that expired at the end of 2013, including small business expensing and bonus depreciation.



Farm Bureau supported a yes vote.
