Michigan Agriculture in the Classroom impacted 106,311 students and 3,184 teachers in 1,545 Michigan schools in 2024 through the following programs.



AGRICULTURAL LEADERSHIP IMPACT

Michigan Foundation for Agriculture programs delivered leadership development opportunities to 493 members and young leaders from 63 county Farm Bureaus in 2024.

High School and Collegiate



Building skills for career readiness, leadership opportunities and advocacy for agriculture.

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

- 124 students from 34 counties competed in six regional High School Discussion Meets.
- 8 Collegiate Farm Bureau members from our 13 collegiate chapters competed in the Collegiate Discussion Meet.
- 440 pails were distributed to high school students through county Farm Bureaus' efforts.
- 38 FFA chapters and Collegiate Farm Bureau members shared consumer messages through #SpeakAgMichigan.

Promotion & Education



Preparing agriculture leaders to be the active voice for agriculture while educating consumers about our industry.

In 2024, Michigan Farm Bureau launched resources, templates, and a grant initiative to encourage county Farm Bureaus to conduct adult-focused consumer outreach to build relationships along the farm-to-fork path.

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

- 59 counties received grants
- 489 Farm Bureau volunteers were involved
- 61,451 non-member children participated
- 45,949 non-member adults participated

Young Farmers



Developing 18-35-year-old agriculture leaders for service in their county Farm Bureaus and communities.

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

- **80 young farmers** competed in District Discussion Meets.
- 42 young farmers from 26 counties, submitted award applications.
- 239 members attending Young Farmer Leaders Conference.
- **648 participants** in Young Farmer Facebook Group.
